Those that are slightly under-ripe or slightly immature when picked may last longer.

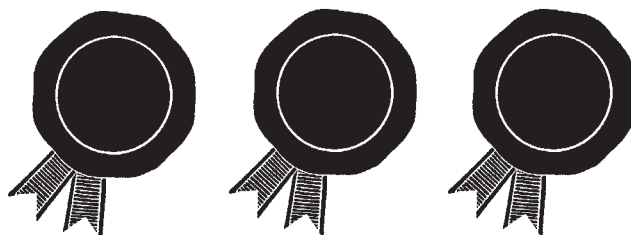
