

DIVISION 12 — FLORICULTURE

Superintendents: Pattie Chesney, Janet Kollman

1. Plants entered for prizes must have been in possession of exhibitor at least 60 days prior to the Fair.
2. Cut flowers must have been grown by the exhibitor.
3. Exhibitors shall place their exhibit with the right number of stems in **clear, glass container** for display—**no colored containers**.
4. Exhibitors shall not totally remove leaves from stems or add extra foliage.
5. Exhibitors shall remove dead flowers and insect damage, and shall remove dirt from leaves.
6. **Each exhibitor is limited to two (2) entries in each lot.**
7. **Plants having won previously at the Rooks County Free Fair will not be eligible to compete again.**
8. All exhibits must be in place by 5:00 p.m. Monday, entry day.
9. **Display is to consist of no less than 3 and no more than 5 stems (cut stems in Class A).**
