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RULES AND REGULATIONS

RULE 1

Section 1

The Rooks County Free Fair reserves to the Board the final and absolute right to interpret these rules and regulations and arbitrate, settle, and determine all matters, questions, and differences in regard to or otherwise arising out of, connected with, or incidental to the Fair.

Section 2

The management reserves the right to amend and add to these rules as they, in their judgment, may deem applicable. In the event of conflict of general or special rules, the latter will govern.

Section 3

Any person who violates any of the following or special rules will forfeit all premium and privileges and be subject to such penalty as the Board may order.

Section 4

The following rules and regulations will apply to each and every department of the Fair, and exhibitors and concessionaires are requested to familiarize themselves with the rules.

Section 5

All livestock entries are to be filed with the Fair Office by July 31, 2023. Mail entries to:

Rooks County Free Fair Box 505 Stockton, Kansas 67669

All other entries must be filed with the Fair Clerk by 5:00 p.m. on entry day, Monday, August 8. All exhibits are to be in place by 5:00 p.m. the same day, except for certain livestock entries. The management reserves the right to reject any entries offered.

All other entries will be released from 1:00 to 2:00 p.m. Saturday, August 12. Failure to comply with this requirement will bar said exhibitor from participation in premiums which may have been awarded by the judge in any department of the Fair.

Section 7

No entry fee will be charged on any animal or article entered for exhibitions, and no money will be taken from any premium winners. All entry blanks must remain in the office of the Entry Clerk.

Section 8

All property of any character entered for competition, display or for any purpose, or being anywhere in the fairgrounds, shall be subject to the control of the Fair Board.

Section 9

In no case shall the Rooks County Free Fair or its officers be held responsible for any loss, damage, accident, injury, or death from any cause of people or animals or cars or machinery, diseases included of any character, while they or their property are on the fairgrounds at any time or place.

Section 10

Exhibitors will be required to keep their places and stalls in a clean condition by removing any filth or litter from in front and behind pens and place litter in designated areas for management to clean up. Alleys and pens should be cleaned by 10:00 a.m. each day and kept in that condition throughout the day as warranted.

Section 11

If the property owners or other interested in the property desire protection against damage from injury, against fire, or from other cause, they must make their own arrangements and pay for such insurance.

Section 12

If it be ascertained that exhibitor or his employees have, in an ungentlemanly manner, taken exception to the judgement ruling of the awarding committee, judge, superintendent or any official of the Rooks County Free Fair, the board can expel exhibitor and employees from competing for a premium or exhibiting on the grounds of the management until he or she has made proper apology and has been reinstated by the majority of the Board of Directors.

Section 13

If is ascertained that an exhibitor has made or caused to make any false statement in regard to any animal or article, or if any exhibitor attempts to interfere with the judges in the performance of his or her duties, he or she shall be excluded from competition on the grounds of the association.

Section 14

The Superintendent shall exclude livestock from competing should there be any unnecessary or embarrassing delay on the part of the exhibitor in bringing the animals into the show ring. Failure to do so will subject said exhibitor to the forfeiture of his or her privileges.

Section 15

Exhibitors shall show their animals at such time and places as may be required by the Superintendent. Refusal to do so will result in the forfeiture of any and all claims for awards.

Section 16

Special care will be taken so that no animal having a communicable disease of any nature enter the grounds at any time during the Fair, and the Fair Board will refuse unloading privileges to any stock having disease.

Section 17

Nothing shall be sold or given away or otherwise disposed of by exhibitors which may in any way conflict with, or which is the subject matter of, any privileges or concession granted or sold by the Rooks County Free Fair Board.

Section 18

No visual or audio recording will be permitted on the fairgrounds without prior approval or consent of the Fair Board.

RULE 2- CLAIMS FOR INJURY

Section 1

No claims for injury to any person or property shall be asserted nor suit instituted or maintained against the Rooks County Free Fair, its officers, or their agents by or on behalf of any person, firm, or corporation, or their agents, representatives, servants or employees having licenses or privileges to exhibit on said fairgrounds or occupying space therein. The Rooks County Free Fair shall not in any manner be responsible therefore, and in case it be subject to any expense or liability, all persons causing same are liable therefore and shall indemnify the Rooks County Free Fair at Stockton, Kansas.

RULE 3- REMOVAL OF OBJECTIONABLE EXHIBITS AND DISPLAYS

Section 1

The management reserves the right to remove from the grounds any exhibits, animals, concession, or show that may be falsely entered or may have signs, banners, or advertising materials of any kind which may be deemed objectionable. Management without assigning a reason may return any money already paid for space or stall, which shall exonerate them from any claim whatsoever on the part of the exhibitor or purchasers.

RULE 4- CONCESSIONS AND PRIVILEGES

Section 1

The Board authorizes the letting of only such privileges or concessions as are necessary to supply the wants of the people or that may add to their comfort, convenience or pleasure, but under no circumstances will a privilege of questionable nature or of a demoralizing tendency be let or in any manner tolerated where the business is conducted in any other than a legitimate and trade-like manner. The sale of alcoholic liquors and games of chance are strictly prohibited. No fireworks of any kind are allowed on the premises.

Section 2

Section 3

Concession space can be contracted for prior to the opening of the Fair. Contract must be signed and full payment received before grounds can be occupied. Any spot not occupied by 5:00 p.m. Monday, August 8, will be declared forfeited.

Section 4

All space allotted must be improved and decorated by the purchasers at their own expense.

Section 5

All lights and power shall be paid by the concessionaires and commercial exhibitors. The association reserves the right to place a meter on any and all lines where, in its judgment, it is advantageous to do so and where the current consumed totals more than the minimum. Each concessionaire and commercial exhibitor must pay for installing his own lights.

Section 6

The Board and Superintendent of Privileges will use every precaution to guard against extortion of any form practiced upon patrons of the Fair. A violation of this rule by any concessionaire will cause the forfeiture of contract money paid, or expulsion, or both, from the grounds as the management or superintendent may direct.

Section 7

If it be ascertained that exhibitors or his employees have, in an ungentlemanly manner, taken exception to the judgement rulings of the awards committee, judge, superintendent, or any official of the Rooks County Free Fair, the Board can expel exhibitor and employees from competing for a premium or exhibiting on the grounds of the management until he or she has made proper apology and has been reinstated by the majority of the Board of Directors.

RULE 5

Section 1- Access to Concessions

Any official representative of the Rooks County Free Fair shall have access to the premises of any exhibitor or concessionaire at any and all times.

Section 2- Care of Concessions

All buildings and grounds space are to be kept neat and clean. The concessionaire is to deposit all refuse and rubbish in the dumpsters provided by the Rooks County Free Fair and is to conduct his premises in a quiet and orderly manner.

Section 3- The Buildings and Stands

All booths, tents, or enclosures must meet the approval of the Rooks County Free Fair management.

Section 4- Price Signs

A sign shall be posted at the front entrance of each stand or enclosures showing the price charged for lunches, meals, or drinks, said sign to meet the approval of the management and to be at all times in view of the customers.

Section 5- Advertising

The tacking, posting, or placing of advertising outside the space contracted will not be permitted. Soliciting be allowed outside the booth or enclosure of any privilege. The use of gongs, bells, or other noisy instruments for the purpose of attracting attention will not be tolerated.

RULE 6—COMMERCIAL EXHIBITS AND DISPLAYS

Section 1

Under no circumstances will a display of a questionable nature or of a demoralizing nature be allowed.

Section 2

Parties desiring to rent commercial display area should contract:

Section 3

Commercial display area should be contracted for prior to opening of the Fair. Rental fee will be paid in full before the space is occupied. Any area not occupied by 5:00 p.m. Monday, August 7 will be declared forfeited.

Section 4

All space must be decorated and improved by the purchasers at their own expense.

Section 5

The Board and the Supervisor of Commercial Displays will use every precaution to guard against extortion of any form practiced upon patrons at the Fair. A violation of this rule by any commercial exhibitor will cause the forfeiture of contract money paid or expulsion, or both, from the grounds as the management or supervisor may direct.

RULE 7

Section 1

No person shall be permitted to distribute matter upon the grounds, except from their places of business or exhibit space.

The tacking or posting of any advertising bills, etc., other than within the space occupied by the exhibits is strictly forbidden. The distribution of hand bills, fliers, and heralds will not, under any circumstances, be permitted except as granted by the Secretary or other Fair officials. Anyone violating this rule is liable to fine or expulsion from the grounds.

RULE 8—PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

Section 1

Awards will be made by a single judge system. The decision of the judges will be final, and no appeal will be considered except in case of protest.

Section 2

The judges in all departments will be appointed by the Fair Board President and approved by the Board of Directors.

Section 3

All premiums awarded under the rules and regulations of this Premium List will be paid in full, according to the rules, but in no case shall a premium be awarded on any article unworthy of same. No entrance fee will be charged, and no money will be deducted from the premium winners.

Section 4

Where there is no competition in a class, it shall be discretionary with the judge whether or not the exhibitors shall receive first, second, or third premium, but in any event, premium money shall be given to correspond with premium winner.

Section 5

No premium will be awarded in any department except as definitely stated in the Premium List or advertised before the Fair in the Stockton Sentinel.

Section 6

All taxi cabs and wholesalers' trucks will be required to purchase a permit from the Fair Board to enter the fairgrounds

PREMIUM LIST

(Special rules in addition to the general rules governing all exhibits)

The following rules will be strictly enforced by the superintendent of his or her department.

- All exhibition animals must be owned by exhibitor or member of his or her immediate family.
- In animal classes, duplicated entries will be received; that is, an owner may try for a certain award with 2 or more suitable animals.
- In animal classes, inclusive entries will be received; that
 is, owner may compete for prizes as singles and again as
 component parts of group. No exhibitor may exhibit
 more than 2 breeds of any class livestock and poultry.
- First premium exhibits in the various classes are in line to compete in their respective classes for Sweepstakes or Champion.
- 5. All livestock exhibits are to remain in place until date and time designated in each division. All other exhibits are to remain in place until 9:00 a.m. Saturday, August 14.
- In addition to cash prizes, ribbons will be given the winners in each class: purple for Champion; blue for First Premium; red for Second Premium; white for Third Premium.
- All entries, other than designated livestock entries, must be in place by 5:00 p.m. Monday, August 8. Exhibits displayed that are not catalogued in Premium Book will be judged and receive ribbon, but no cash prizes will awarded.

OPEN CLASS LIVESTOCK EXHIBITS

- When judging livestock, stress will be placed on the following topics: type, size, quality, symmetry, vigor, constitution, general character of the various breeds, show conditions, action in horses, and fleshing qualities in beef cattle, horses, and sheep.
- All animals will be shown at halter except swine and brought out to the section of the grounds upon which the judging is being done. Do not ask the judge to place ribbons upon the animals in the pens except where there is no competition. Suitable show pens will be provided for the swine classes.

Members intending to sell animals during the sale must turn in a "Sale Intention Form" to their 4-H community leader. The leader must turn in the forms to the Fair Office by Thursday at 1:00 p.m. No changes will be made after this time. Any Sale Intention received after 1:00 p.m. on Thursday will be considered late, and these animals will be placed at the end of the livestock sale and the premium will be capped at the average of the red ribbon premium for that species. Glitter will not be allowed on any animals going though the livestock sale.

4-H and FFA members are limited to one of the following: 2 Market Hogs, or 1 Market Lamb and 1 Meat Goat, or 2 Market Lambs, or 1 Market Hog and 1 Meat Goat, or 2 Meat Goats, or 1 Market Steer and 1 Market Lamb, or 1 Hog or 1 Meat Goat or 1 Market Lamb and 1 Market Hog.

All animals sold in the sale must have been exhibited. No Market Hog weighing under 230 lbs. will be sold through the premium auction. No Market Steer weighing less than 1,000 lbs. will be sold. No Market Lamb that weighs less than 100 lbs. No Meat Goat under 60 lbs. will be sold. A fee of \$25.00 will be withheld for each Market Steer, Hog, Lamb, and Meat Goat that is sold through the 4-H/FFA Livestock Sale. Beef, Sheep, and Swine checkoff fees will also be charged. Checkoff fees will be assessed the rate of \$1.00 for Beef, \$.65 for Swine, and \$.25 for Sheep. All animals going through the sale will be penned and will not be removed until settlement is made with the sale committee. Under no circumstances may private treaty sale of an animal occur after the animal has gone through the ring. Livestock animals sold through the sale will return to the barn and be under the feed and care of the exhibitor until release time at 9:00 a.m. on Saturday. Information will be distributed to the exhibitors sometime through the fair week. Noting where the animal needs to be taken on Saturday morning. An unlimited number of extra sheep, swine, and goats may be sold at the floor bid. Hogs weighing under 230 lbs. will be allowed to sell as extras as long as a bid is received from the buyer. Beef extras will sell at auction following the premium sale. The price of all extra steers will be capped at the highest resale of all steers resold during the premium auction.

A. Buy-back of any animal at the floor price is permissible and can be done by the designating this to the sale committee at the time sale intentions are turned in. These animals shall be returned to the 4-Her's designated fair pen and shall remain there until checkout time. Private treaty resale arrangements of these buy-back animals is permissible at any time prior to or following the sale.

B. A 4-H animal sold at public auction or privately, whether for immediate or future delivery, cannot, from the time of such sale, be shown by the seller or buyer in any Kansas 4-H show. This policy also applies to those animals which have gone through a premium auction whether or not ownership has changed. This rule applies to Breeding Sheep sold through a premium auction as a Market Lamb the previous year.

Private treaty resale arrangements of these buy-back animals is permissible at any time prior to or following:

- Such sale, be shown by the seller or buyer in any Kansas 4-H show. This policy also applies to those animals which have gone through a premium auction whether or not ownership has changed. This rule applies to Breeding Sheep sold through a premium auction as a Market Lamb the previous year.
- Any 4-H animal may be used for the Livestock Judging Contest at the discretion of the Livestock Superintendent.

2023 HEALTH REQUIRMENTS

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- All tests must have been conducted in a state-approved laboratory.
- Animals with active lesions of ringworm, multiple warts visible without close examination, or infested with mange, as determined by officials of the Official Fair Veterinarian, will not be permitted to exhibit.
- 3. Health papers will be copied and kept on file.
- 4. Comingling livestock increases the risk of disease transmission. Every possible risk cannot be controlled. Neither the Rooks County Free Fair nor any officer, person, or organization shall be held responsible for any disease that may be transmitted.

CATTLE

Brucellosis Requirement

All cattle admitted for exhibition must meet 1 of the following classifications:

- Originated in and constitute part of a certified brucellosisfree herd. Herd certification number must be entered on the health certificate.
- 2. Originate from a USDA brucellosis-free classified state. No test required.
- Official calf hood vaccinated animals of beef breeds under 18 months of age and dairy breeds under 18 months of age may show without a brucellosis test. Vaccination tattoo symbol must appear on the health certificate.
- Kansas dairy cattle from herds that have 4 consecutive current negative milk ring tests need not be tested for brucellosis.

- Cattle not qualifying under 1,2,3, or 4 must indicate a negative blood test for brucellosis in a state-federal laboratory in all animals over 6 months of age within 30 day of the show date.
- Out-of-state cattle must comply with Uniform Methods and Rules for interstate movement requirements according to classification of their state. Prior Kansas permit required from B state. Test eligible ages is 18 months
- 7. Health certificates required for heifer calves under 6 months.
- 8. Health papers will be copied and kept on file at the Fair Office.

Tuberculosis Requirement

All cattle admitted for exhibition must meet 1 of the following classifications:

- Originate in and constitute a part of a TB-accredited herd.
 The TB-accredited herd number must appear on the health certificate.
- Originate from USDA classified TB-free state. Kansas is a TB modified accredited free state, but no TB test is required for this show.
- 3. Cattle not qualifying under 1 or 2 must be tested negative to TB within 90 days of the show, except steers and calves under 6 months of age.

SWINE

Out-of-state swine must comply with uniform methods and rules for interstate movement.

SHEEP

- 1. All sheep must be free of any signs of "sore mouth," active fungal infection (ringworm), including club lamb fungus, and other contagious disease. All sheep must be identified with an official USDA premise ID tag. If an exhibitor's animal qualifies for a premise ID tag and is not tagged by fair time, that animal will not be able to participate in the 4-H Show or Livestock Sale. Sheep must be inspected by the Official Fair Veterinarian prior to unloading. Healthy lambs hauled with lambs having fungal infection may not unload.
- 2. All sheep (Breeding and Market Lambs) must be slick shorn (.2 inch) prior to unloading.

GOATS

All goats must be accompanied by an official health certificate and identified with an official USDA premise ID tag or registration tattoo. All exhibitors, please leave official health certificate in the Fair Office. The certificates will be examined by the personnel of the Animal Health Department.

Brucellosis Requirements

1. Goats originating within the State of Kansas do not need to be tested for brucellosis.

- 2. Goats originating out of the State of Kansas must meet I of the following requirements:
- A. Goats must originate in and constitute a part of a certified brucellosis-free goat herd. Herd certification number must be entered on the health certificate.
- B. Goats not qualifying under item A. must be negative to a brucellosis test. Test must be conducted at a state-federal laboratory in all animals over 12 months of age within 60 days of the show date.

Tuberculosis Requirements

- Goats originating within the State of Kansas do not need to be tested for tuberculosis.
- 2. Goats originating out of the State of Kansas must meet 1 of the following requirements:
- A. Goats must originate in and constitute a part of a TB-accredited goat herd. Herd accreditation number must be entered on the health certificate.
- B. Goats not qualifying under item A. must have a negative TB test within 90 days of the show date.
